

Lipid Oxidation & Quality Division Student Travel Grant

The program has been established to encourage student to become active in the LOQ Division and the Society.

The funds allocated to the individuals are intended to partially pay travel and meeting registration expenses to attend the AOCS Annual Meeting. It is anticipated that the funds may not cover the total expenses incurred, and this grant would supplement other travel funds.

NATURE OF THE GRANT

- Maximum number of individual grants per year limited to four (4).
- Total of all grants disbursement for any given year may not exceed \$3,000
 - Individual grants limited to no more than \$1,000
 - Individual grant limits may vary based upon need, location, and funds available
- The review committee will determine which expenses shall be reimbursed.

ELIGIBILITY

- This grant is open to graduate students. Candidates must have not already received a graduate degree, or begun their career employment prior to May of the presentation year.
- Candidates need to have a poster or oral presentations at the AOCS Annual Meeting. Submit an abstract through the AOCS Annual Meeting website.
- Individual can only receive this grant one time.
- Failure to receive a grant does not bar further consideration for subsequent years.
- Professors are limited to nominating one student for this grant.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The applicant should submit:

- An application statement
 - Limited to 300-500-word summary describing the significance of the individual's accomplishments and progress in research
 - Clearly demonstrates how the applicant's research interests are consistent with scope and activities of the LOQ Division, and the applicant's potential for future participation in LOQ activities
- Two-page *curriculum vitae*, including finished courses, GPA, published papers, etc.
- Completed nominating professor form.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: **February 15**
